Join the Reading Revolution

Many children across the 4th Senate District fall behind on reading as early as the 3rd grade. The U.S. Department of Education recommends simple strategies for creating strong readers:

1. Invite a child to read with you every day.

When reading a book where the print is large, point word by word as you read. This will help the child learn that reading goes from left to right and understand that the word he or she says is the word he or she sees.

2. Read a child's favorite book over and over again.

Read many stories with rhyming words and lines that repeat. Invite the child to join in on these parts. Point, word by word, as he or she reads along with you.

3. Discuss new words.

For example: "This big house is called a palace. Who do you think lives in a palace?" Stop and ask about the pictures and about what is happening in the story.

Read from a variety of children's books, including fairy tales, song books, poems, and information books.



Dual Enrollment Opens Doors at Martin Luther King High School

id you know that Arcadia University now offers dual enrollment to students at Martin Luther King High School? Leaders from the schools met and agreed to establish dual enrollment after I discussed the idea with both institutions earlier this year. Arcadia is contributing to the vitality of our community by opening the doors of opportunity to Martin Luther King High School students through college classes and study abroad programs.

In Harrisburg, I am advocating to raise the minimum wage, enact a shale severance tax to fund schools, and commit to responsible state pension payments for retirement in dignity.

hen thousands of community members took to the street to express their loss of faith in our justice system after the Michael Brown and Eric Garner cases, I introduced legislation (SB400) to require an investigation by an independent prosecutor when police use deadly force in Pennsylvania. We are building support for this effort among groups such as Working Families PA, the NAACP of PA and law enforcement leaders like Chief Thomas Nestel of SEPTA.

After holding education roundtables in Philadelphia and Montgomery counties, I learned from residents that our community has many untapped resources that can help our children succeed. I used your feedback to begin developing a literacy volunteer program for elementary school children and dual enrollment for high school students at Arcadia University. Please contact my office if you would like to volunteer as a tutor or assist in the Reading Revolution.

Advocacy in Action

y staff has served many residents since opening our district office in December and additional mobile offices since April. We are excited to announce the opening of a new district office on Germantown Avenue in July.

Since December, staff have assisted with rent rebates, health insurance concerns, voter registration and many other issues. When our office learned that constituents needed tax assistance, we held four free tax events throughout the district to meet that need. Serving the community is about caring for our neighbors, and we can all get involved.

Here's an example of how my staff is helping our neighbors – and how you can do the same:

Barry Prather and his wife, Linda, have five adult children with developmental disabilities. Barry and Linda wanted their children to have the opportunity to live independently in the community, but they were told that no funding was available for service-enriched supported housing. Barry came to my office to discuss this challenge with a staff member, Ms. Jackson. As a result of the family's persistence and determination, Ms. Jackson obtained funds from the county assistance office for all five of the Prather children. The family is overjoyed that their kids now have the resources to live independently in the community.

This story shows us the incredible impact that dedication and persistence can have when we advocate on behalf of our neighbors and ourselves.

I invite you to be an advocate in our district by joining the Reading Revolution. You can donate books, volunteer your time and visit your local school to find out what resources are needed. You have more power than you realize.


