Stronger Together: Employment Opportunities

Jobs and job training are part of our effort to saturate high crime areas in Northwest Philadelphia with "love in action." Jobs and job training can break the cycle of violence for at risk youth. My office has partnered with CareerLink, local community leaders, and elected officials to host three jobs fairs in Germantown, where some neighbors got job offers on the spot. Over 600 people have attended these job fairs.

Infrastructure Job Training

I recommended and advocated for an infrastructure job training program and Governor Josh Shapiro exceeded my expectations and signed an executive order creating a new, first-in-the-nation Workforce Training Program. Over the next five years, this program will create up to 10,000 jobs, invest \$400 million in workforce development, and on-the-job training for infrastructure careers.

This is a major victory for Pennsylvania workers. This

investment, including child-care and other support embedded into the program, will benefit all workers, especially women, and black and brown workers who are being left out of infrastructure jobs. Our advocacy to raise the minimum wage to at least \$15 an hour in Pennsylvania continues. The last time the wage was raised was in 2009. PA workers are long overdue for a raise. This year, my office helped to organize petition signing which received over 1000 signatures and conducted over 50 advocacy visits to legislators.

I introduced legislation to:

- Enact a \$15 minimum wage by January 2024.
- End preemption so that local governments can set their own rates.
- End the \$2.83 tip wage so that there is one fair wage for all, including those in the food service industry.
- Enact a yearly cost-of-living adjustment to avoid 4 repeating this legislative battle year after year.
